- 1. **BY EMAIL** to **entries@benallashow.com** Fill out the appropriate entry form/s (1 per exhibitor), scan and send through with payment details. (More info is on the entry forms)
- 2. **IN PERSON** to the Secretary's Office, just inside the main gates of the Showgrounds, opposite the Rose Gardens. Office times are listed on the inside front cover of the Schedule.
- **3. BY POST** to PO Box 168, Benalla 3671. Entry forms need to arrive by October 7th to allow for return of paperwork. ****Correct entry fees and a DL size Stamped, Self Addressed Express Post Envelope must be enclosed****
- > Entry fees must accompany the Registration Form or the entry will NOT be processed.
- > No phone entries.
- Exhibits can be delivered to the Secretary's Office prior to deadlines. Please note Office hours on the Inside Front Cover.

TIPS FOR EXHIBITING:

- Please read schedule carefully, noting any measurements and method of showing.
- Where 'One Cut' is requested, it means only one stem showing at upper level of container. Stem may be supported, below the level of the container top (using, eg. Paper, another stem, NO wire)
- N.N.D. means Not Necessarily Different.
- D.V. means Different Varieties
- All entries in Potted Plant and Cut Flower Classes must be grown by exhibitor for, at least, 3 months.
- Green bottles are preferred as exhibition containers; some are available in the preparation area.
- Plant/s to be shown only in the container it is being grown in (not inside a decorative pot).
- Pot to be clean.
- Remove any spent blooms/leaves before showing.
- Rose names are desirable.
- Exhibitors display at own risk we recommend not using valuable vases or accessories.
- Saucers: sand must be domed; and all edges covered.
- Miniature gardens must include some horticultural material.

All exhibit tickets to be attached to entries.
