

WAYS TO ENTER:

- 1. **BY EMAIL** to **entries@benallashow.com** Fill out the appropriate entry form/s (1 per exhibitor), scan and send through with payment details. (More info is on the entry forms)
- 2. **IN PERSON** to the Secretary's Office, just inside the main gates of the Showgrounds, opposite the Rose Gardens. Office times are listed on the front cover of the Schedule.
- 3. BY POST to PO Box 168, Benalla 3671. Entry forms need to arrive by October 4th to allow for return of paperwork. **Correct entry fees and a DL size Stamped, Self Addressed Express Post Envelope must be enclosed**
- > Entry fees must accompany the Registration Form or the entry will NOT be processed.
- > No phone entries.
- > Exhibits can be delivered to the Secretary's Office prior to deadlines. Please note Office hours on the Front Cover.
- > NO REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF JUDGING
- Please note: every effort will be made to display all exhibits in space available. When space is limited all eligible exhibits will be judged but not necessarily displayed.
- > Registered exhibits delivered late: judging and display cannot be guaranteed but all reasonable efforts will be made to do so.

Novice Classes: Are classes designed to encourage people to start showing Textiles. Eligible Exhibitors must have never won a first prize in the Textiles Section at any agricultural show. Winners of junior competition are eligible to enter Novice provided they have not won a first prize in the Open or Novice classes previously.

All eyes on soft toys must be child proof. Items deemed not child proof will be disqualified.

Patchwork & Quilting Exhibits: For hanging and displaying purposes, exhibits **MUST** have a pocket across the top of the back of the quilt or wall hanging. Please note: if machine quilted please specify the type of machine Domestic or Long arm. If quilting has been done professionally, please include name of quilter.



REGULATIONS (applicable to classes T15, T20, T33, T44, T68 & T88):

1a. [Class T68 & T88] Each item must be made from Pure Wool/Wool Blend of any ply and must have attached label from wool used or label or receipt from Woollen Mill.

 [Class T33] Knitted/Crocheted articles not acceptable.
 An exhibitor may represent only one Society at Group level and one group at State level.

3. An article having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final, the winning article will then compete at the next Royal Melbourne Show.

4. An article, having won a State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.

5. Each article must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

6. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.

7. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the state in any one show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.

8. All work to have been completed within the last twelve (12) months.
